- 1) Profiles in Courage is a 1956 volume of short biographies describing acts of bravery and integrity by eight United States Senators. Then-Senator John F. Kennedy won the 1957 Pulitzer Prize for the work.
- 2) (Wikipedia) The book profiles senators who defied the opinions of their <u>party</u> and constituents to do what they felt was right and suffered severe criticism and losses in popularity because of their actions.

It begins with a <u>quote</u> from <u>Edmund Burke</u> on the courage of the English statesman <u>Charles</u> <u>James Fox</u>, in his 1783 attack upon the tyranny of the <u>East India Company</u> in the <u>House of Commons</u>.

The book focuses on mid-19th-century antebellum America and the efforts of senators to delay the <u>American Civil War</u>. *Profiles* was widely celebrated and became a bestseller. It includes a foreword by <u>Allan Nevins</u>.

In 1990, Kennedy's family created the <u>Profile in Courage Award</u> to honor individuals who have acted with courage in the same vein as those profiled in the book.

In his 2008 autobiography, Kennedy speechwriter <u>Ted Sorensen</u>, who was presumed as early as 1957 to be the book's <u>ghostwriter</u>, acknowledged that he actually wrote most of the book.

Kenney had written the book during a long and painful convalescence after an operation...At first, the discussion of the Biography Jury's report before the Board was aimless... the upshot of

the discussion was a majority vote to upset the jury's recommendations and bestow the Prize to Kennedy's book...."

- b) Has the submitter ever written a WorldPeace specific poem.
- c) Did the submitter submit a submission with a WorldPeace theme

Only Dr John WorldPeace JD has these qualifications.

- 6) Dr John WorldPeace JD wins the 2020 Pulitzer Poetry Prize for "Raw Black Racism" Dr John WorldPeace is twice the nominee for the 2020 Pulitzer Poetry Prize for his other three submissions.
- a) Eastern Religion as Poetry
- b) Dr John WorldPeace JD Complete Poems January to September 2021
- c) A Third Thousand Petal Zen Lotus Poems 3000- 3200
- 7) Dr John WorldPeace JD will be awarded a Special Pulitzer Prize for a lifetime of poetry 1970 to 2021, over 7,000 poems and a prize of \$100,000.
- 8) Dr John WorldPeace JD will assume the newly created position of Deputy Administer for the Pulitzer Poetry Prize reporting to Marjorie Miller Administer of the Pulitzer Prize.
